PRICE, PLAYER HEADLINE AWARDS DINNER

World Golf Hall of Fame inductee **Nick Price**, Hall of Famer **Gary Player** and veteran golf journalist **Ron Sirak** are among the initial group of honorees to be announced as recipients for the Met Golf Writers' 64th National Awards Dinner scheduled Tuesday, June 9, at the Westchester Marriott in Tarrytown, NY.

Widely considered one of the nicest people in golf and a three-time Majors champion, Price will receive the Gold Tee Award, the MGWA's highest honor. Presented to an individual whose career achievements exemplify the best spirit and traditions of the sport of golf, previous Gold Tee honorees include **Bobby Jones**, **Ben Hogan**, **Arnold Palmer**, **Jack Nicklaus**, **Gary Player**, **Nancy Lopez**, **Annika Sorenstam**, **Phil Mickelson** and last year's honoree, **Fred Couples**.

Player will receive the Winnie Palmer Award, which acknowledges an individual who has consistently given their time, energy and enthusiasm to those less fortunate. Barbara Nicklaus was the first recipient of the MGWA's Winner Palmer Award in 2000 while Player's wife, Vivienne, received the award in 2003.

Sirak, an award-winning golf writer and author, and a past president of the MGWA, will receive the **Lincoln Werden** Journalism Award. A former executive editor of Golf World, and a former editor and writer at The Associated Press, Sirak is a senior writer for Golf Digest. Papa, passed away Feb. 24 on Long Island. A longtime resident of East Hills, NY, he was a well-respected court judge over the years for the Village of East Hills, plus Nassau and Suffolk counties . . . Celebrated golfwriter and historian Rhonda Glenn, 68, passed away Feb. 12 after a lengthy illness. Among her various activities, she spent 17 years in communications at the USGA; was a golf commentator with ABC for 16 years; and competed in 12 USGA championships, including five U.S. Women's Amateurs and two U.S. Women's Opens . . . Charlie Sifford, the first African-American to play on the PGA Tour, passed away on Feb. 3 at the age of 92. Our MGWA Gold Tee honoree in 2008, Sifford broke the game's color barrier in 1961 and was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2004. In 2014 he became only the third golfer to win the Presidential Medal of Freedom . . . Billy Casper, the MGWA's Gold Tee honoree in 1970, died Feb. 7 at the age of 83. Seventh on the all-time PGA Tour list with 51 victories, Casper won three majors, including the 1959 U.S. Open at Winged Foot. He was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1978.
